Fieldwork Dates: 25th January 2013

**Data Collection Method:** The survey was conducted via online panel. Invitations to complete surveys were sent out to members of the panel. Differential response rates from different demographic groups were taken into account.

Population Sampled: All adults aged 18+ in Great Britain

Sample Size: 1,005

**Data Weighting:** Data were weighted to the profile of all adults aged 18+. Data were weighted by gender, age, region and 2010 vote. Targets for the weighted data were derived from ONS census data.

**Margin of Error:** It should be remembered at all times that a sample of 1,005 residents aged 18+ were interviewed, and not the entire population. Consequently, all results are subject to margin of error, which mean that not all differences are statistically significant. For example, in a question where 50% (the worst case scenario as far as margin of error is concerned) gave a particular answer, with a sample of 1,005 we can be 95% certain that the 'true' value will fall within the range of 3.1% either side of that 50% figure from the sample.

Data were analysed and weighted by Survation and presented by Patrick Briône and Damian Lyons Lowe.
