Prepared on behalf of the Mail on Sunday



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Fieldwork Dates: 21st September 2012

Data Collection Method: The survey was conducted via online panel. Invitations to complete surveys were sent out to members of the panel. Differential response rates from different demographic groups were taken into account.

Population Sampled: All adults aged 18+ in England, Scotland and Wales.

Sample Size: 1012

Data Weighting: Data were weighted to the profile of all adults aged 18+. Data were weighted by gender, age, region, past vote and likelihood to vote. Targets for the weighted data were derived from the National Readership Survey, a random probability survey comprising 36,000 random face-to-face interviews conducted annually.

Margin of Error: It should be remembered at all times that a sample of 1012 residents aged 18+ were interviewed, and not the entire population of the areas. Consequently, all results are subject to margin of error, which mean that not all differences are statistically significant. For example, in a question where 50% (the worst case scenario as far as margin of error is concerned) gave a particular answer, with a sample of 1012 we can be 95% certain that the 'true' value will fall within the range of 3.1% either side of that 50% figure from the sample.

Data were analysed and weighted by Survation and presented by Patrick Bri ne and Damian Lyons Lowe.
