## Methodology

Fieldwork Dates	Sampling Method
19th – 20th January 2015	Data called were pre-selected on the basis of a high probability of likely Jewish identity, estimated from a range of demographic indicators selected by Survation in consultation with Jewish community leaders and academics. Respondents were asked to confirm before the start of the survey whether they were Jewish (including secular or non-practicing) and
Data Collection Method	only those who did were continued into the survey.
The survey was conducted via telephone.	Data Weighting
Population Sampled	Data were weighted to the profile of all Jewish adults aged 18+ in the UK. Data were weighted by age, sex, and region. Targets for the weighted data were derived from Office of National Statistics 2011 Census data.
All residents aged 18+ in the United Kingdom who identify as Jewish	Margin of Error
Sample Size	Because only a sample of the full population was interviewed, all results are subject to margin of error, meaning that not all differences are statistically significant. For example, in a question where 50% (the worst case scenario as far as margin of
939	error is concerned) gave a particular answer, with a sample of 939 it is 95% certain that the 'true' value will fall within the range of 3.2% from the sample result. Subsamples from the cross-breaks will be subject to higher margin of error, conclusions drawn from crossbreaks with very small sub-samples should be treated with caution.



#### Question presentation

All data tables shown in full below, in order and wording put to respondents, including but not limited to all tables relating to published data and all relevant tables preceding them. Tables for demographic questions might not be included but these should be clear from the cross-breaks on published tables. In all questions where the responses are a list of parties, names or statements, these will typically have been read to respondents in a randomising order. The only questions which would not have had randomising responses would be those in which there was a natural order to maintain – e.g. a scale from "strongly agree" to "strongly disagree", a list of numbers from 0 to 10 or questions which had factual rather than opinionrelated answers such as demographic information. "Other", "Don't know" and "Refused" responses are not prompted.

Not all questions will have necessarily been asked to all respondents - this is because they may be follow-on questions from previous questions or only appropriate to certain demographic groups. Lower response counts should make clear where this has occurred.

Data were analysed and weighted by Survation and presented by Patrick Briône and Damian Lyons Lowe.
