Methodology

Fieldwork Times

16th April 2015: 9.30pm-10.05pm

Data Collection Method

The survey was conducted online. Respondents were recruited during the 36 hours before the debate via a screening survey sent to a nationally representative sample which asked which TV programmes they were planning to watch on Thursday evening. Those who indicated they were planning to watch the BBC Election Debate 2015 were sent an email during the debate with a survey link which became live as soon as the final speaker had made their concluding remarks.

Population Sampled

All residents aged 18+ in Great Britain who watched the BBC Election Debate 2015 live.

Sample Size

1,013

Data Weighting

Data were weighted to the profile of all Great British adults aged 18+. Data were weighted by age, sex, region, socio-economic group and past vote. Targets for the weighted data were derived from Office for National Statistics mid-year population figures and the results of the 2010 General Election. Note that while the sample was weighted to the profile of all Great British adults, the population sampled was only those who had watched the debate.

Margin of Error

Because only a sample of the full population was interviewed, all results are subject to margin of error, meaning that not all differences are statistically significant. For example, in a question where 50% (the worst case scenario as far as margin of error is concerned) gave a particular answer, with a sample of 1,013 it is 95% certain that the 'true' value will fall within the range of 3.1% from the sample result. Subsamples from the cross-breaks will be subject to higher margin of error, conclusions drawn from crossbreaks with very small sub-samples should be treated with caution.

Screening

Respondents entering the survey were first asked to confirm they had just watched the BBC Election Debate 2015 programme. Those who said they had not watched the programme were screened out.



Question presentation

All data tables shown in full below, in order and wording put to respondents, including but not limited to all tables relating to published data and all relevant tables preceding them. Tables for demographic questions might not be included but these should be clear from the cross-breaks on published tables. In all questions where the responses are a list of parties, names or statements, these will typically have been displayed to respondents in a randomising order. The only questions which would not have had randomising responses would be those in which there was a natural order to maintain – e.g. a scale from "strongly agree" to "strongly disagree", a list of numbers from 0 to 10 or questions which had factual rather than opinion-related answers such as demographic information. "Other", "Don't know" and "Refused" responses are not randomised.

Not all questions will have necessarily been asked to all respondents – this is because they may be follow-on questions from previous questions or only appropriate to certain demographic groups. Lower response counts should make clear where this has occurred.
