Methodology

Fieldwork Dates

4th – 5th July 2016. Fieldwork concluded before the results of the first ballot of Conservative MPs were announced.

Data Collection Method

The survey was conducted via telephone. A combination of both landline and mobile data were called.

Population Sampled

All Conservative Councillors in the UK.

Sample Size

1,062

Data Weighting

Data were unweighted.

Margin of Error

Because only a sample of the full population was interviewed, all results are subject to margin of error, meaning that not all differences are statistically significant. For example, in a question where 50% (the worst case scenario as far as margin of error is concerned) gave a particular answer, with a sample of 1,008 it is 95% certain that the 'true' value will fall within the range of 3.0% from the sample result. Subsamples from the cross-breaks will be subject to higher margin of error, conclusions drawn from crossbreaks with very small sub-samples should be treated with caution.

Voting Intention

In order to assess likely voting intention, respondents were asked which of the five candidates were their top preference, with "Stephen Crabb", "Liam Fox", "Theresa May", "Andrea Leadsom" and "Michael Gove" prompted in a randomising order.

If a respondent selected "Theresa May", they skipped through to the end of the survey. However, if they selected any of the other four candidates, respondents were asked how they would vote in a series of head-to-head contests with Theresa May, resembling the ballot paper Conservative Councillors may receive. These head-to-heads were also prompted in a randomising order.

Question Presentation

All data tables shown in full below, in order and wording put to respondents, including but not limited to all tables relating to published data and all relevant tables preceding them. Tables for demographic questions might not be included but these should be clear from the cross-breaks on published tables. In all questions where the responses are a list of parties, names or statements, these will typically have been displayed to respondents in a randomising order. The only questions which would not have had randomising responses would be those in which there was a natural order to maintain – e.g. a scale from “strongly agree” to “strongly disagree”, a list of numbers from 0 to 10 or questions which had factual rather than opinion-related answers such as demographic information. “Other”, “Don't know” and “Refused” responses are not prompted.

Not all questions will have necessarily been asked to all respondents – this is because they may be follow-on questions from previous questions or only appropriate to certain demographic groups. Lower response counts should make clear where this has occurred.

Data were analysed and weighted by Suration.
