

**Cabinet Reshuffle Poll**  
Prepared on behalf of the Mail on Sunday



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**Fieldwork Dates:** 24<sup>th</sup> August 2012

**Data Collection Method:** The survey was conducted via online panel. Invitations to complete surveys were sent out to members of the panel. Differential response rates from different demographic groups were taken into account.

**Population Sampled:** All adults aged 18+ in England, Scotland and Wales.

**Sample Size:** 1023

**Data Weighting:** Data were weighted to the profile of all adults aged 18+. Data were weighted by gender, age, region, past vote and likelihood to vote. Targets for the weighted data were derived from the National Readership Survey, a random probability survey comprising 36,000 random face-to-face interviews conducted annually.

Data were analysed and weighted by Danny Kelly and presented by Damian Lyons Lowe and Patrick Briône of Survation.
